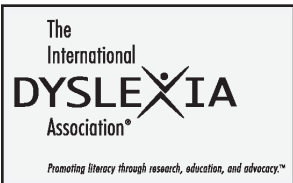

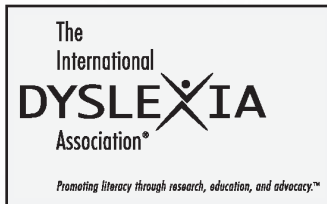

Gordon received his Ph.D. in Developmental Psychobiology from the University of Connecticut (Storrs, Connecticut) in 1980 and has over 25 years of research experience related to the development of the brain and the understanding of developmental dyslexia. He is the author and editor of over 80 scientific articles, reviews, and books. Sherman speaks nationally and internationally to parents, teachers, and scientists about cerebrodiversity, learning differences, brain development and the enlightened classroom.

“Cerebrodiversity in the Classroom: Lessons from Neuroscience” – Gordon Sherman, Ph.D.

The brain of a person with dyslexia is different from the of someone without dyslexia. Dyslexic brains are uniquely organized and function differently. This alternative brain design reflects cerebrodiversity – a term that refers to human neural heterogeneity and the resulting profiles of cognitive strengths and weaknesses.

Ann Alexander, M.D., a developmental pediatrician trained at Duke University, has worked extensively in the field of language/learning disabilities. In 1986, Ann was involved in founding the Morris Child Development Center in Gainesville, Florida to provide assessment and treatment solutions for children with language-learning disabilities. Recognizing the need for a similar neurodevelopmental assessment and treatment center in Arizona, Ann, opened the Wellington-Alexander Center in 2003 in hopes of achieving the same kinds of success for children here in the Phoenix area. Additio0ally, Ann is involved in dyslexia research with Dr. Joe Torgesen through research grants awarded by the NICHD.
